

International Agreement of 3+2 Program
Between
School of Electrical and Information Engineering of Sydney University,
Sydney, Australia

And
Chien-Shiung Wu College (Honors) of Southeast University, Nanjing,
P.R.China

This Agreement is made between Chien-Shiung Wu College(Honors) (hereafter as CSWC) of Southeast University (hereafter as SEU), Nanjing, P.R.China and School of Electrical and Information Engineering (hereafter as EIE) of Sydney University (hereafter as SU), Sydney, Australia. The parties agree as follows:

1. Agreement and Variation

1.1 CSWC and EIE wish to establish a collaborative education program defined as 3+2 Program, in which qualified students enrolled at CSWC of SEU, after successfully completing the first 3 years of their undergraduate curriculum, will be accepted into selected fields of study at EIE of SU for next 2 years to finish a required training curriculum to qualify for their bachelor's degree awarded at SEU and a Master's degree to be awarded by SU.

1.2 The parties have agreed that the collaborative education program will be conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions set out in this Agreement.

1.3 No agreement or understanding varying or extending this agreement shall be legally binding upon either party unless specified in writing and signed by both Parties. Parties may agree to modify the agreement in writing to the extent that it is inconsistent. This being so, the later agreement is the one which binding.

2. The Program

2.1 The academic program of the 3+2 Program will be implemented and administered in two phases. During Phase I, the candidates of this 3+2 Program shall study at CSWC to complete the first 3 of 4 years Bachelor's Degree program. The nominee recommended by CSWC and evaluated and accepted by EIE in accordance with EIE's admission procedures and standards will enter Phase II of the 3+2 Program. In Phase II, the students will continue their studies in the chosen discipline at EIE. Each successful student will receive a Bachelor's degree from SEU and a Master's degree from SU.

2.2 The applicants for this Program shall be selected initially by CSWC, with EIE making the final admission decision. Only successful applicants shall be accepted by EIE. The following selection criteria will generally apply, but may be varied in appropriate cases:

2.2.1 Be in good academic standing as reflected by a minimum 85% or GPA3.5 on 4.8 scale.

2.2.2 The language proficiency for entry must be at least TOFEL 95 or IELTS 6.5, or get the approval from EIE through telephone interview.

2.2.3 The assessment for the nominee can be referred to that for other international students wishing to enrol at SU.

3. Number of students and the administrative process

3.1 The maximum number of nominee recommended by CSWC every year is 4, only students succeed in the assessment and officially admitted by EIE can participate this Program.

3.2 CSWC shall provide the name list of nominee and their application materials to EIE before 15 March every year.

3.3 EIE shall provide students who pass the assessment with official admission letters before 30 April every year.

3.4 Students in Phase II will be offered all of the usual privileges of full time international students studying at SU in accordance with all applicable laws and regulations.

3.5 During the students' full time study at EIE, each student's academic performance will be evaluated by EIE.

3.6 After students successfully complete the first year study in EIE, their official transcripts will be delivered to SEU and reviewed by SEU. If the students' academic performance is approved by SEU, they will be awarded the Graduation Certificate and Bachelor's Degree of SEU. Then students continue their second year study in EIE. After 2 years' study in EIE, if the students' academic performance satisfies the requirement of Master's program of EIE, they will be awarded the Master's Degree of SU.

4. The Tuition and Fees

4.1 Student's fees for *Phase I* will be established and collected by SEU, and SU shall have no claim against those fees.

4.2 Students in *Phase II* will be responsible for all costs to study at SU. The costs shall include travel between China and Australia, tuition fees, room and board, insurances and all of the prescribed fees to be collected by SU. SEU will have no claim against fees collected by SU.

5. Terms and Termination

5.1 This Agreement commences on the date of the last signature by a party to the Agreement. The duration of the agreement is three years.

5.2 In the third year after commencement of the Agreement, the parties will undertake a joint evaluation and the agreement will continue to be effective for another term of 3 years unless otherwise agreed as in clause 5.3.

5.3 This Agreement may be terminated by a party serving on the other party at least 6 months prior written notice. If the termination date falls during a phase of the Program, the Agreement will be terminated after the completion date of that phase of the Program.

6. Controlling Laws

6.1 Before restoring to external dispute resolution mechanism, the Parties shall attempt to settle by negotiation any dispute in relation to this Agreement.

6.2 At all times while SU is to perform under this Agreement SU's obligation shall be subject to and be controlled by the laws of Australia (local laws). This Agreement controls the total performance by SU of its obligations under this Agreement.

6.3 At all times while SEU is performing under this Agreement, SEU's obligations shall be subject to and be controlled by the laws of People's Republic of China. This Agreement controls the total performance by SEU of its obligations under this Agreement.

7. Amendment

Any future amendment of the Agreement should be agreed upon and signed by both parties.
